

A: Download this driver from the Atheros Website for your laptop and install it The driver should be automatically installed, and your wireless should work fine Charles Wellesley (Irish judge) Sir Charles Wellesley (died 14 June 1818) was an Irish-born judge and political figure in New South Wales. He was appointed Chief Justice of New South Wales in 1813 but died at sea on his way to Australia. Biography Charles Wellesley was born in 1801 in County Londonderry, Ireland, son of Admiral of the Fleet, The 3rd Duke of Wellington. He was educated at Eton and at St John's College, Cambridge and was called to the Bar at Lincoln's Inn in 1823. Charles Wellesley arrived in Sydney on the Pitt, with his family in 1831, one of the earliest settlers of New South Wales. He held the office of Commissary of the Counties of Upper and Lower Hunter. He was appointed a Judge of the Admiralty Court in 1835, a position which he held until his death. He was also a member of the Supreme Court and of the Legislative Council. Wellesley died at sea on his way to Australia on 14 June 1818.
